



## **ICE CREW POLICY**

Curl Moncton has an ice crew of good, dedicated ice maintenance volunteers; however, with the number of regular leagues and special curling events, more help is needed to cover when some are away and to ensure the burden doesn't fall on a few.

### **SCHEDULING:**

The scheduling of the ice crew is the responsibility of the Ice Manager, should that position be filled. The ice crew members will contact the Ice Manager if they are unable to fulfill their duties on any given occasion or with any concerns about ice conditions.

### **REGULAR WEEKDAY ICE MAINTENANCE:**

#### **TERMS:**

- Full ice maintenance: shave, shammy, pebble and nip.
- Partial ice maintenance: Pebble and nip

Volunteers do full and partial ice maintenance during the week, primarily for day league play. In appreciation for their commitment, their membership fee will be reduced by 50% if they do one full and one partial or three partial ice maintenance shifts, translating to 120 to 150 minutes per week.

### **SPECIAL EVENT ICE MAINTENANCE:**

Each time an ice crew member does ice maintenance, either full or partial, outside of the regularly scheduled weekday maintenance, the crew member would be compensated as follows:

Full Ice Maintenance (5 sheets) – One-person Crew:	\$25
Full Ice Maintenance (5 sheets) – Two-person Crew:	\$15 each
Full Ice Maintenance (10 sheets) – Three-person Crew:	\$20 each
Partial Ice Maintenance (5 sheets) – One-person Crew:	\$10*

Partial Ice Maintenance (10 sheets) – Two-person Crew:      \$6 each\*

*\*NOTE: The partial ice maintenance compensation would apply only to the core ice crew; all other volunteers would be compensated via the token program.*

A log book will be kept to show the weekday schedule for ice maintenance (for 50% membership discount) and to record those crew members doing special event ice maintenance qualifying for the stipend.

The compensation stipend will be calculated and paid out at the end of each month.

A sign-in sheet will be kept for volunteers helping under the token program.
